How to separate and put out garbage

### Recycleable

Even if you only put out one, please tie it with string.

### Newspapers(including inserts)



Tie them crosswise

OThin booklets should be classified as "Mag azines and other paper.'

### Cardboard

Only those with corrugafed edges are accepted.

Remove as much adhesive tape, fasteners, etc. as possible.



### Paper pack

Only items with a white interior(Not aluminum coated) are eligible. Anything else should be disposed of as "burnable garbage" ORinse, cut open and dry.

### Magazines and other papers

OPaper boxes such as tissue boxes should be crushed before disposal.

Remove everything except the paper.

OPlace small papers(postcards, envelopes, etc.) in a paper bag and

tie it with string to prevent them from scattering.

# Can(Limited to beverages) and food)

O Caps and lids are [Non-burnable garbage] .

O Do not crush them so they can be recycled.



# Bottles(For beverages and food only)

- O Crowns, caps, and broken items are non-burnable waste. O If possible, have retailers take
- back 1.8L bottles and beer bottles.

### Plastic bottle

Oil bottles go on in the "burnable waste" category. OWater server bottles should be disposed of as burnable waste.

O Do not crush so that can be recycled.

(Fresh fish, meat, prepared foods, vegetables)

O Food trays other than white should be

# Food waste, clothing, waste paper, etc.

O Drain food waste thoroughly before disposing of it.

O Remove metal fittings from clothing,

shoes, bags, etc. before putting them out.

## O Do not chop it up into small pieces.

Plastic containers and packaging (waste plastic)

Since plastic products cannot be collected as plastic ontainers and packaging, they should be disposed of as

burnable garbage."

Examples include plastic spoons, straws, clearfiles, hangers, buckets, etc.



# Bulky garbage (Cannot be disposed of at garbage collection points

There are three disposal methods:

- ▶ Bring it directly to the Clean Station Nasu or the Otawara Regional Clean Center.
- Request a pick-up from a town general waste disposal company.
- Request door-to-door collection.(Application required)





### ■Example of items

Mobile phones, digital cameras, DVD player, USB nemorysticks, caiculators, hair dryers, watches, game

insoles, accessories for small home appliances, etc.









### ! Items that are not considered used small home appliances.

- O Television, air conditioner, refrigerator, washing machine, clothes dryer. →As this item is subject to the Home. Appliance Recycling Law, you will need to purchase a recycling ticket at the post office.
- O Items that become bulky garbage.
- · Large home appliances.(massage chairs, running machines, etc.)
- · Wooden products.(speakers, kotatsu, organs, etc.)
- OEquipment that uses fluorocarbons. (dehumidifiers, etc.)→Consult with the store









# Glass, ceramics, metals O Spray cans and stove gas cylinders should only be disposed of after the contents have been completely used up. O Broken glass, knives, etc. should be wrapped in Drink By type transparen bag (45.L or less) Plastic bags are not allowed wrap it in paper and write "キケン!"on it. You can also put it in the box of the replaced fluorescent tube.) Dry batteries (manganese, alkaline), button batteries, coinbatterie small rechargeable batteries, mobile battelies, electronic cigarette For button batteries, coin batteries, and rechargeable batteries
